Q: What if we aren't able to hire someone?

The goal is for ministries with children and youth to continue without interruption. I'll guide our Sunday School Superintendent Nancy Wilburn, parents, and volunteers until a hire is made or another arrangement surfaces. I ask everyone to honor Kris's request to take a break from any scheduled responsibilities for a bit.

We have a Youth Council that needs retooling. Our Book of Discipline provides a structure for a Children's Council which, when organized, is led by the Director of Children's Ministries and will work closely with me and others to vision, plan, and advocate for children, particularly in the areas of faith development, safety, and discipleship.

Q: What about the Nursery and Sunday School classes?

The Nursery Coordinator will schedule second person helpers for all scheduled worship services, special services, and programs and recruit and train nursery volunteers.
