



Friends,

What a wonderful Pentecost Sunday we had! I hope that those of you who were in worship felt the Holy Spirit moving among us as I did. It was wonderful to see 8 of our young people confirmed into the membership of Bethany, and 7 others joining as well.

These young people have spent eight weeks preparing themselves for this journey in their spiritual life and have learned from me, from each other, and from their mentors, family, and friends. Among the things they learned was about the Trinity - Father, Son, and Spirit, and the love that God has for each of us regardless of who we are, what we have done, and how we have run from Him, only to be brought back by his forgiving love and His desire for us to be close to Him. They also were reminded of the Great Commandment to love one another as Jesus has loved us and talked about how hard it is at times to love as Jesus loves, but our young people have a better concept of how this is plays out in our culture than many of us adults.

We talked about what it means to be a church with “open hearts, open minds, and open doors” and how they felt Bethany exemplified this slogan, and we talked about how we live into the mission of the United Methodist Church to “make disciples for the transformation of the world.” Another conversation was had concerning our Book Of Discipline and our responsibility to follow the guidelines and rules of our church. We also had a conversation about General Conference and how it was meeting in Oregon with United Methodist representatives from all around the world; that this was the body that could change, add, amend, and edit our Book Of Discipline.

Much was learned these eight weeks and they know that they will be learning, expanding, and living these truths throughout their lives.

As I reflect on these young people, the conversations we had, and the influence this church has already had on their lives, I cannot help but also think about General Conference and how conversations are going there. I have been reading the articles, watching some of the live-streaming, and observing a church that at times appears to forget who we are serving and how to live out our mission statement. As happens at our Virginia Annual Conference, many of the thorny issues don't get resolved and are left for another year, or in the case of General Conference, four years. Many of these thorny issues affect our brothers and sisters and by not resolving them, these persons are left on the fringes again. I don't know what the outcome of General Conference will be but I do feel the pain of those who feel their voices continue to be silenced. It is hard to realize that we are part of a church that continues to silence people, especially when Jesus listened to the voices of the people and helped them find healing and transformation when they listened to him. Maybe we are not listening to Jesus.

## ONE SERVICE OR TWO?

There has been some conversation about whether we should have one worship service or two on Sunday mornings, especially in the summer. The last time Bethany combined worship services was in the 1980's when Pastor Eugene Setchel was here (1984-88), and done mostly because of the energy crisis, saving on heat and air-conditioning bills. Well, we are not in an energy crisis, but we are, according to some, in an attendance crisis. That may be, for attendance fluctuates on any given Sunday for no apparent reason. Since January of this year, our 8:30 service has averaged 50 and our 11:00 service has averaged 110. That does not count Easter Sunday when we had 216 at our combined service at 10:00, or Pentecost Sunday when we had 123 at our combined service at 10:00.

There are pros and cons either way. If we had only one service, the whole church family could worship together and would know who each other is. If we had one service, would it be 8:30, 11:00, or a neutral time, 10:00? With that, we know that 8:30 people mostly don't want to come later and our 11:00 people don't like to come earlier, except for Sunday School. Splitting the difference to 10:00 would mean that Sunday School would need to start earlier.

At our last Administrative Council meeting, I opened up this conversation and was met with conversation about the above pros and cons, but the most revealing conversation was that it really boils down to no one wanting to change; most are happy with the way things are. People choose to come at 8:30 because they like the early hour, and by comparison, most of them also attend Sunday School. People who choose to come at 11:00 like the later hour; some come for Sunday School, and most of our families with children come at this time, giving them more time to get ready, as is the case with those who experience physical limitations requiring more time in the morning.

My opinion on this is I am here to serve God, and lead you, as we worship and serve together, and I will do that regardless of how many services we have. I think it is important for us to find ways to be together as the family of God, whether it is in worship or fellowship. Easter Sunday was a good example of us worshipping together at one hour and it was a great celebration. I was hopeful that Pentecost would be just as good a celebration as we celebrated the "birthday" of the Christian church and received our confirmation class, and others into church membership. I was disappointed that more did not come and experience the power of the Holy Spirit that morning like we who were in attendance did.

So, to put this conversation to rest for now, we will continue with both services, 8:30 and 11:00, and Sunday School at 9:45. There will be opportunities for me to bring us together for one worship hour and I hope to do this at least quarterly, or so. We are also going to schedule, at least quarterly, or more, congregational covered-dish suppers. We need to know each other and not treat each other as strangers, and it is my hope that when we have these opportunities we will want to be together in fellowship as the body, family of God.

## Church and Society Committee Environmental Tip # 59

There are always new problems to worry about but the Zika virus and its potential effects on the fetuses of pregnant women is something to take very seriously. The Zika virus is caused by the bites of mosquitos carrying the virus and if a pregnant woman has the virus the fetus may develop microcephaly and brain plaques, causing it to be born with an extremely small head and a deformed brain.

According to the CDC, the US Center for Disease Control, as of May 11, 2016, there were 503 diagnosed cases of Zika virus in the US, 15 of those were in Virginia, and 48 of those diagnosed were pregnant. All of those cases were the result of travel to countries, predominantly in Central and South America, where mosquitos are carrying the virus, except for 10 people who were infected as a result of sexual contact with a person returning from a trip. The biggest concerns are that if people with the virus are bitten by mosquitos in the US, the virus could spread to the mosquito population here. Spring and summer are the worst seasons for mosquito infestations, and the summer Olympic Games are scheduled to be held in Brazil with thousands of international participants and fans in attendance and then returning to their home countries. Brazil has had 1271 babies born with confirmed cases of microcephaly.

The virus itself is usually mild, with flu-like symptoms of fever, aching muscles and joints, and in some cases a rash. It only lasts a week or two and is sometimes so mild that it isn’t detected.

What can we do to protect ourselves from the Zika virus? The main things are to try to control the mosquito population and to take precautions to limit exposure to mosquito bites. With the wet spring we are having there are bound to be plenty of mosquitos this summer. But there are many things each of us can do to limit the problem in our own yards and community. Make sure you keep your yard mowed, holes filled, and garden under control. Check for any standing water in your yard; if you have water buckets or a wheelbarrow that you keep outside empty them and store them upside down; water bowls for pets should be emptied and refilled with fresh water regularly; old tires and other things that could collect and hold rain water should be moved or covered. Make sure the drainage ditch along your property is free of debris and can run freely and make sure others in your subdivision or neighborhood are doing the same. If there are any junk cars abandoned in or around the neighborhood, contact the county for removal.

If mosquitos are a real problem, try to use sprays that are as environmentally safe as possible, and use citrus based deterrents like citronella candles and torches on your patio or porch. You can also foster a bat community by putting up a bat house. Each bat eats hundreds of

mosquitos a day, far more than birds, and are nature's own mosquito control.

Protecting yourself from mosquitos is necessary too, so use wear repellent like Cutter or Deep Woods Off when you are working outside. The best thing I have found for repelling mosquitos, chiggers and ticks is Neutrogena Body Oil (light sesame formula). It really works! It is an after bath oil and perfectly safe even for children and much safer than commercial repellents. It's sold at WalMart for about \$7 a bottle and goes a long way but you can put it in a spray bottle and add about 1/3 rubbing alcohol and it still works. I use the fragrance free version and neither one permanently stains clothing. Try it!
