Dear member of Bethany United Methodist Church,

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ.

This letter announces a special session Church Conference at Bethany United Methodist Church on Sunday, May 6, 2018, after the 11:00 a.m. service.

The two motions come from Administrative Council upon recommendation from your Trustees; both were approved at the February 20, 2018 Council meeting. To encourage broader participation by members of the church, and because these motions deal with property issues and a valued ministry that is dear to us, our charge conference is being convened as a special session Church Conference, which extends the vote to all professing members of the local church present at such meetings. For such a major decision, we need your approval.

Motion 1: Approval that the Esther Thompson Cottage be sold within established guidelines as dictated by the York River District of The United Methodist Church.

Motion 2: Approval that proceeds of the sale (after expenses) be split with 50% going to missions associated with emergency housing relief and 50% going to our Capital Improvement Designated Fund. The five recommended missions associated with emergency housing relief are: our Pastor's Discretionary Fund, our local Mission Designated Fund, our Missionary Clara Biswas (emergency housing in Cambodia), Gloucester Housing Partnership, and G.U.E.S.T. (Gloucester United Emergency Shelter Team).

Brothers and Sisters,

Have you noticed our church roof lately? Yes, it is indeed missing many shingles and our Trustees are hard at work getting estimates to have the entire roof replaced. We have so far received estimates ranging from \$47,000 - \$61,000. Our Capital Improvement Designated Fund currently has \$35,604 in it. I would like to ask you to prayerfully consider making a 2nd Mile contribution to our Capital Improvement Fund. It would be wonderful to be able to replace the entire roof at the same time and to not take out a loan to do it. Pray also for us to listen and hear God as He shares His wisdom and guidance with us!

Thank you for your continued generosity in supporting our General Fund. As of our April 10th finance meeting we have received \$96,665 towards our General Fund. Because of your faithfulness in fulfilling your Faith Promises our daily ministries and missions continue to grow and thrive.
