## **Donations of clothing and 'useful' household items for the Community Center in McClure, VA**

The McClure River Community Development Center, Inc., in McClure, Virginia, needs assistance to continue their mission to their community. The center was established in 1974 and has been committed to assist in education, health and family care, and recreational opportunities for the citizens of the area. The center works in partnership with church, college, and community groups from across their region.

Mary and JR White and several local volunteers are the folks who, in one of the poorest corners of our state, manage the center. They are trying to provide educational workshops, S.H.A.R.E. food program, and other assistance. They also run a volunteer program to bring in volunteers to work in the community. The center provides a refuge for the local population, who can come and find educational help, clothing, Christmas presents for their children; and they find fellowship and Christian love and caring---Christian love and caring, even when, sometimes, that's almost all Mary and JR have to offer. This past Christmas the youth of Bethany raised over \$350 to help purchase Christmas gifts for the children in McClure.

So, on Monday, September 28, Susan and I are planning on going out to deliver clothing and other 'useful' items we can gather. The Center will accept donations of clothes, household items, and furniture, much like what we take to CHKD or other service organizations in our community. They of course can accept money -- if you wish to donate, I would suggest you make your donation to Bethany UMC as a second-mile gift.

Susan and I have not set up a collection point, however if you have items you'd like to send, please let us know so we can begin making transportation arrangements.
