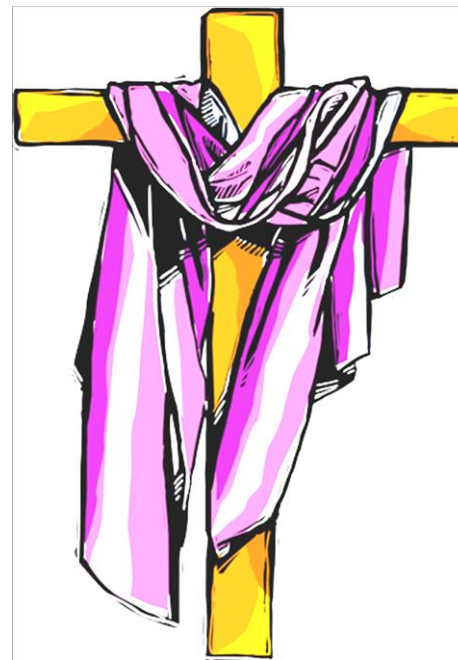

Dear Friends,

Grace to you and peace from our Lord Jesus Christ.

In just a few short days the season of Lent will be upon us. Beginning with Ash Wednesday on February 10 and ending on Resurrection Day, Easter Sunday, March 27, we are called to a time of preparation and a time of repentance, as we take the journey of our lives following Jesus all the way to the cross. What a journey that could be!

Lent can be the most important time of the year to nurture our inner life, a time during which we not only prepare ourselves to celebrate the mystery of the death and resurrection of Jesus, but also the death and resurrection that constantly takes place within us. Life is a continuing process of the death of the old and the familiar, and being reborn again into a new hope, a new trust, and a new love. The death and resurrection of Jesus therefore is not just an historical event that took place a long time ago, but an inner event that takes place in our own heart when we are willing to be attentive to it.

God calls us as he called to Joel to return to me with all your hearts, with fasting, with weeping, and with sorrow; for the Lord waits, ready to forgive, ready to make new, ready to receive us.

When we live Lent attentively and gently, then Easter can truly be a celebration during which the full proclamation of the risen Christ will echo into the deepest place of our being!

The Finance Committee had our first meeting of 2016 on January 12th. We heard great news about Bethany's financial status! In 2015 we received 98% of what was promised to support the ministries and missions of the church! That is beyond wonderful! I praise God for His and your generosity! Total funds received for the General Fund in 2015 were \$356,127. Additionally you went the 2nd Mile and supported our Designated Funds and other ministries and missions by donating a total of \$54,102! God is alive and well here at Bethany Church!

ENDOWMENT COMMITTEE —The Bethany Endowment Fund balance as of December 31, 2015, was \$31,728.35. Our October Potato Bar fundraiser and unrelated donations to the Endowment Fund added over \$1100 to our balance and we are very pleased with the progress we are making. We now have a balance over 3 times our original 2011 investment. However our December balance did show a \$512 drop in value from our November balance. As we have entered the first few weeks of 2016, the market has dropped considerably and is expected to trend down and remain very volatile as China and most other countries continue struggling to recover from the deepest recession we have experienced in over 75 years. The U.S. is one of the only countries to have emerged from the recession, adding enough jobs to achieve the lowest unemployment figures in years and continuing to show economic growth. However we will always be affected by the economic conditions in the countries with whom we trade.

We started 2016 with 2541 shares in the Virginia United Methodist Foundation's Balanced Fund, managed by the Humphrey-Kelly Group within Merrill Lynch. The value or cost of each share was \$12.48 on December 31, 2015, about \$.21 lower than it was at the end of November, and has probably dropped another \$.40 or so by today, January 15, 2016. That would be bad news if we were planning to sell our shares, but that is not how endowment funds work. The shares we purchase remain in the fund forever and will not be sold unless Bethany suffers a catastrophic loss and the Administrative Board chooses to sell them. The interest and dividends keep being reinvested until the fund has a principle balance large enough to be self-sustaining. At that point some of the earnings can be withdrawn to support missions, education, or music programs which we are not able to include in our budget. Until that time, maybe 10 to 20 years from now, we should take advantage of opportunities to buy shares at a lower value or cost whenever possible. The Balanced Fund is a lower risk investment and generally will not drop as much as other funds and stocks in the market, but the price will fluctuate with changing market conditions.

So what can we all do during this market downturn? Of course you could donate to the Bethany Endowment Fund if you are able. To keep our economy growing try to buy goods manufactured in the USA, produce grown in the USA, support foreign companies that have manufacturing plants in the USA employing U.S. workers, and try to support small local start-up businesses, including local restaurants that will hire locally and buy supplies locally. With God's help and our own efforts we can help our endowment grow and help sustain the progress our U.S. economy has made.

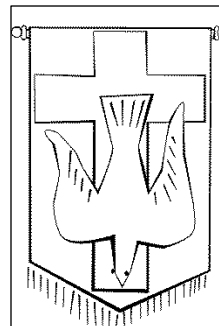

Church and Society Committee Environmental Tip # 57

February is beginning and March will soon be here with more daylight hours to push up crocus and daffodil blooms and signal our trees and shrubs to start pumping sap up the stems and trunks again. Before dormancy is broken and new growth starts to appear is the best time to remove dead or damaged limbs and to prune out unwanted branches. Sucker shoots and branches that rub against other branches should be pruned out or cut back, but be cautious not to prune too heavily as it will cause the tree to produce even more sucker shoots. On fruit trees, branches growing downward or that are too long or thin to support the weight of fruit should be cut back to encourage strong growth. Any branch that you cut with a circumference larger than your little finger should be painted with tree paint. Tree paint is a tar-like substance that seals the cut keeping the sap in and insect pests out. Tree paint is available at nurseries and most hardware stores.

It is also the right time to spray shrubs and fruit trees with dormant spray. It is an oil based spray that seeps into cracks in the bark and provides protection from many types of insect pests and diseases. Oil spray is approved for organic gardening, will not damage the environment, and is used by some growers all year. Tree fertilizer spikes can be tapped into the ground around each tree at the drip line (the circle formed if the ends of the branches were dripping after a rain). Fertilizer spikes placed too close to the trunk of the tree can burn the roots. If you spread fertilizer, do so before a light rain so that it gets soaked in to the soil at the drip line rather than getting washed away into drainage ditches or streams where it can cause algae blooms. A few days' work in the next month will strengthen your trees and produce more blossoms and fruit.
